KITSAP MINERAL AND GEM SOCIETY GENERAL MEETING

13 MARCH 2009

The meeting was called to order by President, Tony Schackmann. The Juniors led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Tonight we have a guest speaker from Kopachuck State Park, Ranger Matthew (Matt) Smith. He brought the club up to date on the proposed closure of 55 out of 120 Washington State Parks and answered questions the best he was able. Some of the questions and answers were:

Will the Federal stimulus plans being awarded be able to subsidize expenses that are forcing the closure of our park? Matt said that he honestly did not know but seriously doubted we'd be able to use the funding that way.

What will happen to the parks once they are closed? How will the 'riffraff' be kept out? When the parks close all support for facilities and services will cease. The only support that will be available is if someone calls in to report a problem.

Several possible solutions are being considered. Some parks may be taken over by private organizations but there are a lot of administrative and structural issues that make it cost prohibitive for most of these organizations to absorb.

Matt's suggestion is to contact your State Legislation Representatives. Let them know how you feel – speak up – take action.

Jim McClure has more information as well as contact information if you need it. Information can also be found on the KMGS and the NW Federation websites and by contacting your local and State representatives.

In addition to the risks our State Parks are facing, other public lands are facing similar situations of closure due to efforts to protect paleontological interests. One hundred and sixty actions are being bundled together. This will mean closure of digging sites to rock hounds and fossil collectors. Mark Stephens shared a letter he received from Jay Inslee who responded to and email Mark sent expressing is concerns. Linda Mathison did the same and also received a response. Even if we aren't able to come to an equitable agreement it's good to know someone responded from the other side.

Membership: Bobbie Sack asked everyone to please verify their information in the club directory and if corrections are necessary forms are available for noting what needs to be changed.

Announcements: The KMGS workshop is being held on Saturday, March 28th at the Sunnyslope Improvement Association. Members will provide equipment and instruction for those who are interested in everything from slabbing to cabbing. Join the potluck and the fun.

The Port Townsend Club will host their annual Gemboree on Saturday, April 25th. If anyone is interested in doing wax castings, that session will be held on Friday, April 18th. More information will be available at the April KMGS meeting.

The next Mineral Council meeting will be held in Ellensburg on Saturday, March 28th.

Correspondence: We received a very nice thank you note from the Kitsap Food Bank for our donation in December.

Scholarships: Jack Eads and his committee have mailed the announcements to the school that applications for scholarships are now being accepted. The students must live in the Kitsap County area and have interest in majoring in the field of earth sciences.

Guests: Welcome to Heidi Mecham, Melia Wing and Darrell Franck and Gage Guptil who are visiting our meeting tonight.

Display Table: Many wonderfully talented wire wrappers shared their beautiful creations, explaining techniques and tools. No two pieces were alike and were the envy of everyone. Our local Backyard Rock Hound, Jack Eads, shared his box of rocks that he graciously donated to the evening's raffle. Thank you Jack! Bob Lavery shared some interesting stories of his and his wife's adventures digging for Hermiston diamonds in New York. Arnie Urdahl had some mystery rocks and asked for help identifying what they were.

In addition to the wonderful array of treasures, John Hubbard whet many members' appetite for adventure by showing off some of his fabulous carnelian collection. Saturday, March 14th, John will be leading a dig in Kalama for more of this beautiful gem.


